A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT...

At one point in my life I had no interest in going to college. You see, I was a drummer in a rock and roll band and that is how I was going to make millions. College was not even something I wanted to think about for long. However, the musician's life was a hard one. There are nightly gigs (if you are lucky), travel schedules, time away from home, and lots of ways to get into trouble. Then there was that voice in my head from parents and grandparents telling me to get an education because no one can take that away from you. You have something that you can depend on. So, I signed up for some classes at a local community college (George Mason University, which was at the time, a community college of the University of Virginia) and something changed.

I really liked what I was studying. Unlike high school, I did my homework religiously. I applied myself and found a world of excitement and interest. It was a wonderful experience. I ultimately transferred to the University of Virginia and received several degrees from that fine institution.

The path was not a straight one, and I stumbled on occasion. After a three year tour in the military, including a year in North Vietnam, I was pretty convinced that higher education was where I wanted my career to be. The voices of my parents and grandparents turned out to be right.

NEW PAY FOR PRINT SYSTEM

Starting with the fall 2014 semester printing will no longer be free in the computer labs at Blue Ridge. Beginning on August 18, 2014 the pay for print system will be fully activated. The cost to print will be 5 cents per page. If you print a two page document and it is double sided that will equate to a charge of 10 cents.

All students will start with a one-time \$5.00 credit preloaded onto their printing account. If you exhaust this free credit you will need to add value to your printing account. Also all print jobs will now be held and will only print upon user release. Please note that jobs that are not released within 24 hours of submission are deleted.

After logging into a lab computer you will notice a green box in the upper right hand corner of the screen. This will display your available printing balance.



A MESSAGE FROM DISIBILTY SERVICES

Dear Students,

I want to extend a warm welcome to all new and returning students. I hope you will have a rewarding and successful academic year. I would like to inform all students of the services offered to individuals with disabilities. If you do not have a documented disability, then the information contained in this letter does not apply to you.

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as well as the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, states that no qualified person shall, solely by reason of disability, be denied access to, participation in, or the benefits of, any program or activity offered by an institution of higher education. In the spirit of these laws, Blue Ridge Community and Technical College provides equal opportunity to individuals with disabilities. The Office of Student Success provides support and assistance to students with disabilities. Among the services provided are those related to accessibility of campus facilities, reasonable accommodations, advocacy for student needs and referral to appropriate governmental and community agencies.

In order to receive services and accommodations, it is necessary that you provide the College with documentation that contains a diagnosis of the specific disability from a qualified professional, and provides a rationale for the requested accommodations. Students can submit a high school Individual Education Plan (IEP) or 504 Plan. The documents used must be less than five years old. The College has the right to review documentation and determine individual accommodations and services. Previous provision of service, or lack of it, does not guarantee or preclude college services.

A MESSAGE FROM FINANCIAL AID

Important Changes to Remember

- Bookstore credits for each term will now be limited to \$1000.
- Federal student loans will be disbursed in two disbursements rather than one. The first
 disbursement will be approximately 30 days into the term and the second disbursement will
 be at the midpoint of the term. This will affect the timing and amounts of financial aid
 refunds, if applicable.

THIS IS AN EXAMPLE ONLY AND **NOT YOUR** SPECIFIC CASE. BE SURE TO PLAN ACCORDINGLY -

Total Aid for Fall 2014 Semester:

\$5,000.00 federal student loan (regardless of type) - 2 EQUAL Disbursements of \$2500.00

From FIRST DISBURSEMENT (30 DAYS AFTER SCHOOL STARTS)

\$2,500

- \$1,716 (Tuition and Fees)
- \$ 750 (Books bought on FA Credit)
- = <mark>\$ 34 Refund</mark>

From **SECOND** DISBURSEMENT (AFTER MIDTERMS)

\$2,500

- <u>\$ -0-</u> (provided no further charges)
- = **\$2,500** Refund

This is not LESS money; just distributed on a different timeline.

 To ensure responsible borrowing and increase awareness of student loan indebtedness, additional loan counseling will occur for students wanting to borrow more than \$2000 in unsubsidized loan funds. Borrow only what you need to keep your loan payments manageable!


A one-on-one tutor session?
