HLC TRAINING TAKE-AWAYS

BRCTC is committed to preparing the college for the HLC site visit. Faculty and staff traveled to Chicago to attend assessment training including Emerging Leaders and Strategic Assessment.



- 1. Aligning the assessments with the learning objectives is important to help students understand the reason for assignments.
- 2. Engagement and student participation is critical in the learning process, as it helps the student retain more information.
- 3. The WHY gives the student a reason to learn beyond the letter grade.

These three teaching strategies increase student desire to complete the program.

What is the difference between HLC and other accrediting agencies?

There are two types of educational accreditation: institutional and specialized. HLC provides institutional accreditation. Specialized accrediting bodies evaluate particular units, schools, or programs within an institution.

Are all BRCTC programs accredited?

The Higher Learning Commission is an institutional level accreditation agency. Some programs or degrees at an institution (particularly in professional fields) may have accreditation from a specialized agency or association. Students preparing for careers that require licensure should inquire with their state or licensing agency to determine if specialized accreditation of their program or degree is required.

Does BRCTC offer accredited online degree programs?

BRCTC is approved by the Higher Learning Commission to offer online degree programs. While BRCTC does have programs in which 50% or more of the coursework could be completed online, the institution does not offer any degree or certificate programs which are fully online.

Do BRCTC credits or degrees transfer to other HLC accredited institutions?

Each institution determines its own policies and procedures for accepting transfer credits. The Commission expects institutions to have clear policies on transfer of credit. Questions about the transferability of credits should be directed to the institution that the student is interested in attending.

What does the HLC Evaluate during a comprehensive visit?

The Commission evaluates the entire education institution in terms of its mission and the HLC's Criteria for Accreditation. Aside from assessing formal educational activities, it evaluates such things as governance and administration, financial stability, admissions and student services, institutional resources, student learning, institutional effectiveness, and relationships with internal and external constituencies.

What is the Institutional Update?

All affiliated institutions are required to complete the Commission's Institutional Update on Organizational Information and Operational Indicators each year This report, which is completed online, provides the commission with up-to-date information on the scope of activities of each affiliated institution and sufficient information to

understand and respond to significant shifts in an institution's capacity and/or scope of educational activities.

How do Faculty, Staff, and Students get involved in the accreditation process?

- Become familiar with BRCTC's mission statement and reflect on faculty, staff, and students contributions to fulfilling that mission.
- Continue to contribute to the ongoing assessment of BRCTC's programs.
- Help to gather existing information and resources at the departmental or program level.
- Attend and participate in dialogue sessions on specific topics.
- Respond to surveys conducted.
- Communicate what HLC is all about.
- Be prepared to talk about individual views and experiences with members of the HLC site visit team should the opportunity to interact with one or more of the team members arise during the site visit.
