

Articulation Agreement Between Potomac State College of West Virginia University and Blue Ridge Community and Technical College

Bachelor of Applied Science Degree with an Emphasis in Criminal Justice

Potomac State College of West Virginia University agrees to articulate Blue Ridge Community and Technical College's Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) Degree in Criminal Justice to satisfy the requirements for admission to Potomac State College's Bachelor of Applied Science (B.A.S.)—Criminal Justice Emphasis.

Blue Ridge Community and Technical College A.A.S. graduates in Criminal Justice will receive transfer credit for not less than 60 of the 121 credits required to complete the B.A.S. with an emphasis in Criminal Justice at Potomac State College of West Virginia University.

To receive a Bachelor of Applied Science, Blue Ridge Community and Technical College graduates must complete 61 credits of B.A.S. coursework, as specified in the attached Advisement Sheet.

In order to meet B.A.S. General Education requirements, Blue Ridge Community and Technical College A.A.S. graduates will be required to select a 3 credit lower or upper division B.A.S. elective in the Humanities or Fine Arts, and to select six credits of upper division electives in General Education subjects. This requirement does not increase the total number of credits required to complete the B.A.S., but does restrict acceptable course selections in some B.A.S. electives (see attached advising sheet).

Blue Ridge Community and Technical College graduates must complete the final 30 credit hours in residence at PSC. Students may also be required to earn up to 8 hours in their major field regardless of the number of hours or the nature of the course transferred.

All B.A.S. graduates will complete 40 credits of upper division credit (300- and 400-level courses), including 30 credits of required 300- and 400-level criminal justice courses.

All B.A.S. graduates will complete a total of at least 121 credits.
