

## What's Bruin?



A year later he accepted a full-time faculty position and currently sits as the Chair of the Allied Health Sciences Division. His love for his motorcycle is rivaled only by his love for higher education. With over thirteen years as an educator, his science and medical experience are valuable assets to Blue Ridge CTC.

The Allied Health Sciences Division currently offers fourteen certificate, certification, and associate degree programs in fields such as Nursing, Paramedic, Healthcare Professions, Medical Coding and Billing, Medical Assisting, Physical Therapist Assistant, Dental Assistant, Pharmacy and Phlebotomy Technicians. Richard is very excited about the new health sciences facilities provided by the new headquarters building. The brand new chemistry, biology/microbiology, and anatomy and physiology laboratories create opportunities for growth within the department.

The Allied Health Sciences program is proactively finding new ways to grow and expand. A current initiative is underway to develop new partnerships with local medical facilities in order to provide broader externship opportunities for Blue Ridge students. Working alongside Crystal Minnick-Greek, Clinical Coordinator, they hope to

add several more externship locations to the ten currently available. Blue Ridge CTC now offers a Physical Therapist Assistant Program. Dr. Chrystal McDonald and Michelle Sheely have dedicated time and effort to ensuring this program can now be completed entirely through BRCTC. Through the efforts of EMS/Paramedic Program Coordinator, Randy Spies, Clinical Coordinator, Don Weigel, and Sue Reneker, Coordinator of Fast-Track Programs, program expansions are underway at Headquarters and Morgan County Extension Campuses.

With a staff of highly qualified adjuncts, dedicated full-time faculty members and staff, Richard credits the division's progressive mindset to the collaboration of skilled professionals here at Blue Ridge CTC. Along with the aforementioned faculty and staff members, he would like to acknowledge Louise Black, Kathy Monroe, John Westerfield, Dr. John Jacko, Beth Shanholtzer, Carmeene Secola, and Vice-President, Dr. George Perry for their enduring dedication. Richard shared, "The camaraderie and commitment to student success by all of the Allied Health Faculty make our program highly successful."
