Since December 13, 2019 and over the Winter Break, the Blue Ridge Testing Center underwent a top to bottom transformation.

Everything from the Center's overall design, its functionality and atmosphere, space, storage, and accommodation capabilities, to its technology, and monitoring systems, all have been changed to better accommodate our students and community. Here are a few of the changes that we have made.



To begin with, the new design of our updated Testing Center was created from a vision: a vision to create a more professional, private, aesthetically pleasing and practical testing space for our students and community. In order to achieve this vision, we simply increased the overall privacy. Each station now is individual; it has its own testing space within an upholstered cubicle. Every station workspace is made of a solid, dark wood surface and offers approximately 36 inches (3ft) worth of space. In order to provide a better typing experience, the keyboards have been installed ergonomically to adjust from right to left. In addition to these things, one of our desks has been expanded to a full 48 inches (4ft) in length and has been raised an extra 3 inches in height in order to accommodate students or testing candidates that may require this space.



In addition to the amount of workspace being provided to our testing candidates, additional space for their personal items has also been significantly increased. A new set of lockers are on their way. These new lockers will accommodate a wider variety of candidate belongings such as backpacks, briefcases, and more.

Finally, we have made several updates in regards to technology and security. These new systems allow us to better monitor our testing candidates during their exams. The first and most important technological update was the installation of new overhead 360° cameras. These cameras give us a complete visual of the entire room, as well as each individual desk. We have also installed a nifty piece of software, which allows us to monitor every computer screen in the room, log our candidates into their tests from our admin station and even message them during testing. This system provides us with the capabilities for faster seating and makes re-accessing candidate exams a little easier. In addition, at the entrance to the study room, there are now two self-checking kiosks, which will speed up and simplify our check in/ check out process. From the overall design, to the new storage capabilities and space, to the technological upgrades, the Blue Ridge Testing Center has been transformed into a very relaxing, private, and professional examination area for our students and community.

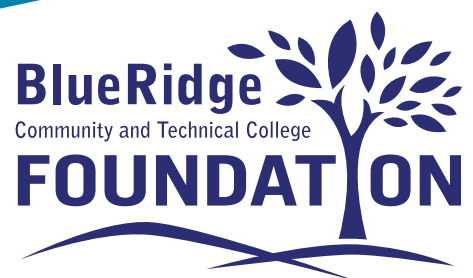
Bring a flash drive with digital artwork to Kelly Shurnitski in Suite 2200 on The Main Campus.

DIRTY RICE WITH SMOKED SAUSAGE

Ingredients

1 cup long grain white rice
2 1/2 cups chicken stock, divided
1 tablespoon vegetable oil
1/2 pound smoked pork sausage, sliced
1 clove garlic, minced
1 small onion, chopped
1/2 stalk celery, chopped
1/2 medium green bell pepper, chopped
1/8 teaspoon cayenne
2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley leaves
Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper to taste

Makes 3-4 Servings

Directions

To make the rice, in a medium saucepan combine the rice and chicken stock. Bring to a boil, reduce the heat and simmer until all the stock is absorbed into the rice - about 20 minutes.

Meanwhile, heat oil in a heavy-bottomed saute pan over medium-high heat. Brown the sausage. Once browned, add the garlic, onion, celery, and green bell pepper. Cook until softened, about 5 minutes. Season with salt and pepper.

Add 1 cup chicken stock and cayenne. Cook until the stock has reduced a little. Add the cooked rice and parsley and stir thoroughly. Taste and season with salt and pepper, if necessary.
