WV Recovery Coach Academy

The WVRCA is a four-day intensive, virtual online training program. Additionally, Students complete 16 clinical training hours as arranged by WVRCA through Blue Ridge Recovery Center in Charles Town, WV. Recovery Coaches promote recovery by removing barriers and obstacles to recovery and serving personal guides and mentors for people seeking or already in recovery.

The training focuses on providing individuals with the skills needed to guide, mentor and support anyone who would like to enter into or sustain long-term recovery from an addiction to alcohol or other drugs. The WVRCA prepares participants by helping them to actively listen, ask good questions, and discover and manage their own issues.

This training is for anyone who is interested in becoming a recovery coach. If your profession involves the recovery field, you may want to consider the West Virginia Recovery Coach Academy. This training utilizes a dynamic approach to learning that blends both process and content.

WV Advanced Medical Recovery Coach

Students who complete the Recovery Coach Academy and the Advanced Medical Center Recovery Coach Training receive a Skill Set Certificate of Completion from Blue Ridge Community and Technical College as a Recovery Coach Professional (RPC). The skill set certificate of completion is endorsed by the West Virginia Recovery Coach Academy and the Greater Recovery and Community Empowerment (GRaCE) as elevating the standards for recovery coaches.

As more entities (hospitals, providers, and prisons) employ recovery coaches, a RPC signifies a level of competence and expertise. A RPC is proficient in the art and science of recovery coaching through actively listening, asking good questions with motivational interviewing, managing biases, and treating people as resources. These skills are essential in recovery coaching.

Advanced Medical Center Recovery Coach Academy includes 12 hours of Emergency Department Recovery Coach (EDEC), 16 hours of RC Ethics, 12 hours RC professionalism, and 6 - 12 hours of Medically Assisted Treatment (MAT) plus internship. The course offers 3 third party college credits.

EPA Lead Paint Abatement

ATTENTION: General Contractors, Painters, Plumbers, Carpenters & Electricians:

Any contractor who removes or disturbs lead paint surfaces after April 2010 is required by federal law to be EPA Lead Safe Certified for pre-1978 housing and child occupied facilities painting or renovation projects. This one-day Lead Safe Training class satisfies Federal requirements.

This program does not include a national or state certification objective which in most states requires 1 to 2 years of training or education.

If you seek a career in a high-growth field, our eight-week program prepares you for success as a dental assistant. As a key member of the healthcare team, you'll work han-in-hand with dentists and hygienists to provide quality and corrective dental care. Course content includes medical terminology specific to the pharmacy, reading and interpreting prescriptions and defining drugs by generic and brand names. Students learn dosage calculations, I.V. flow rates, drug compounding, dose conversions, dispensing of prescriptions, inventory control and billing and reimbursement.

As our population grows and ages, skilled pharmacy professionals must supply the demand. Within 10 weeks, a part-time, Fast Track certification as pharmacy technician prepares you to potentially work in a pharmacy, performing substantial duties such as retrieving drugs in the correct dosage and strength, filling prescriptions, and preparing medications for dispensing to patients. The program also prepares students to potentially sit for the national certification exam.

What are my career options?

As a pharmacy technician, you work in a pharmacy, filling prescriptions under the direction of a pharmacist. You may choose to work in retail pharmacies, mail order pharmacies, or home infusion pharmacies, as well as long term care facilities, hospitals, and clinics. This course is potentially eligible for college credit after the successful completion of the program.

Phlebotomy Technician

This 90-hour Phlebotomy Technician Program prepares professionals to collect blood specimens from clients for the purpose of laboratory analysis. Students become familiar with all aspects related to blood collection and develop comprehensive skills to perform venipunctures completely and safely. Classroom and lab work includes terminology, anatomy and physiology; blood collection procedures; specimen hands-on practice; and training in skills and techniques to perform puncture methods. Note: There is no outside externship rotation included with this program.

The phlebotomy technician is a vital member of the clinical lab team; whose main function is to obtain patients' blood specimens. The field of phlebotomy has greatly expanded in the past several years, and this team member's role has recently been brought into sharper focus. Our part-time, 13-week program gives you the skills to collect blood specimens and create a stress-free patient environment.

What are my career options?

As a phlebotomy technician, you can pursue employment in a variety of settings, including hospitals, health centers, medical group practices, HMO's, public health facilities, veteran hospitals and insurance carriers. This course is potentially eligible for college credit after the successful completion of the program.

ANIMAL CARE CAREERS

Animal Care Nursing Assistant

The training consists of nine models each of which must be completed with a passing grade in order to receive a certificate of completion. The training provides 150 hours of classroom and hands-on training plus 10 hours of volunteer service. This training prepares students to assist licensed Veterinarians and Veterinary Technicians in a variety of animal care facilities including veterinary practices, veterinary hospitals, animal control facilities, humane society facilities, research facilities, boarding facilities, and pet retail facilities.

Training consists of:

- Veterinary Office Practices
- Veterinary Terminology
- Animal Restraint
- Exam Room Procedures and Safety
- Pharmacology

Prerequisites: Students must be 18 years of age and complete the animal restraint hands-on pre-test, and be able to lift 40-50 lbs. to a waist high table.

Working with animals is by nature dangerous. Students assume all liability and responsibility for injuries. Students may be required to complete a rabies series of injections at their own expense, if bitten during the course of this course. BRCTC does not provide insurance coverage for injuries, students are required to provide their own insurance coverage and/or are responsible for all medical bills related to injuries incurred while studying or completing assignments for this program of study.
