On October 1, the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) opened for next school year.

Filling out the FAFSA early is a good idea if you plan to attend college during the 2021-2022 academic year. Some funds are reserved on a first come-first serve basis. There are also varying deadlines for state funding, and if the FAFSA is not submitted on time the funds will not be available to you.

To apply for the FAFSA, visit www.fafsa.gov and log on using your username and password. If this is your first time applying, you will need to create an FSA ID (username and password) before starting the FAFSA. If you are a dependent student your parents will also need to create an FSA ID.

The FAFSA requires the following information:

- · Demographic information
- Series of questions to determine your dependency status
- Tax information for student from 2019, and parent if student is dependent
- The number of people in a student's household, as defined by the FAFSA
- Electronic signature(s) from student, and parent if student is dependent



If there are significant changes to your tax information since 2019, input that information as requested and once you submit your FAFSA, follow up with the Financial Aid Office. Financial Aid will let you know what information is needed in order to correctly determine your amount of financial aid for the upcoming year.

You Have an Academic Advisor!

How can your academic advisor help you?

Did you know that you were assigned a faculty academic advisor as soon as you were admitted as a new student? Each degree program at Blue Ridge CTC is unique, and your faculty advisor is the expert in your program of study. Your advisor knows exactly when classes that count toward your degree will be offered each semester. He or she will help you create error-free class schedules until your graduation day. Your advisor is also a mentor who will discuss your future career or transfer goals with you. Advisors have real-life work experience in your chosen field of study.

For example, Challice LaRose (Human Services Program Coordinator) has worked as a social worker at an emergency children's shelter. Craig Smith (Criminal Justice Program Coordinator) worked for the Winchester Police Department for 26 years. Joshua Rider (Education Program Coordinator) was an elementary school teacher and library media specialist for 8 years prior to coming to Blue Ridge CTC.

Who is my academic advisor? How do I make an appointment?

Each Blue Ridge CTC division (Professional Studies and University Transfer, Allied Health, and Workforce and Engineering Technologies) offers advisement options. If you have not scheduled an appointment to create a Spring course schedule, it's not too late! All advisors have scheduling tools (such as Calendly) that you can use to make an appointment.



P&G AND BLUE RIDGE CTC PARTNER TO TRAIN LAB TECHNICIANS



P&G and Blue Ridge CTC Partner to Train Lab Technicians.

Blue Ridge Community and Technical College and Procter & Gamble (P&G) continue to partner in training of laboratory technicians moving into the workforce!

After discussions began in July of 2020, Blue Ridge CTC Applied Laboratory Technician Program Coordinator, Elizabeth Spring, traveled to Cincinnati in August 2020 and completed training at the P&G facility. By participating in the training, Spring became better equipped to incorporate specific testing techniques into the existing quality assurance curriculum at Blue Ridge CTC.





Upon returning to campus, Spring was excited to launch the first round of training for four P&G Technicians during September 2020. In addition, Blue Ridge CTC received grant funding that supported the purchase of new instrumentation equipment required for this training. As new lab technicians begin the onboarding process with P&G, the College continues to add additional sessions to accommodate training needs.

Careers in Unmanned Aerial Systems

BRCTC Applied Unmanned Aerial Systems (UAS) Technologies students master the operation of professional small unmanned aircraft systems. Students learn aerial photography, videography, and photogrammetry, which enables the creation of high-resolution three-dimensional models.

There are careers opportunities in the Martinsburg area using drone technology and skills. Careers in data science and the application of geographic information systems software are used to analyze crop nutrients, determine environmental impacts, and map wetland areas. Aerial photo, video, and photogrammetry are used for: infrastructure inspection, construction earthwork calculation, and crime scene reconstruction.

Is a career in applied remote sensing and data analytics in your future? The UAS program is now accepting enrollment for Spring 2021, and space is limited.


Survey for December Graduates
