Blue Ridge CTC Student Wins Workforce Focused Scholarship



Michael McClintock is a cybersecurity intern and working toward two associates degrees and an Information Security certificate at Blue Ridge Community and Technical College (BRCTC). He is also a member of BRCTC's chapter of Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society, through which he recently received the New Century Workforce Pathway Scholarship. McClintock is excited to have received the scholarship.

The New Century Workforce Pathway Scholarship supports students at associate degree-granting institutions as they plan to enter the workforce upon the completion of a degree or certificate. Over 2,000 students were nominated from more than 1,200 college campuses and only one scholar was selected from each state. The program is sponsored by The Coca-Cola Foundation and Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society.


12th Edition Now Available!




Survey for May Graduates
