^{*}Students who complete HIST 210 (WVU HIST 250) and select the "United States" as an "Area of Concentration" will have completed the 200-level course for that concentration and can replace that course with an elective. Students who do not wish to peruse "United States" as an concentration will need to follow the plan as presented.

Students must have a 2.0 GPA in HIS courses in order to be admitted directly into the History program upon transferring to West Virginia University. Students must earn a minimum GPA of 2.2 with no grade lower than a C- in all courses applied to the History Major Requirements.

Students pursuing a degree in History at WVU are required to complete a double major, formal minor, or informal minor. WVU offers over 100 minors that complement major fields of study, build on students' unique interests, expand perspectives, and broaden skills. Blue Ridge Community and Technical College students may begin completion of certain minors at Blue Ridge CTC by utilizing elective hours to take courses equivalent to the minor's introductory requirements at WVU.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with a completed Associate of Science or Associate of Arts degree, will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.

^{**}Students who choose Spanish or German as their foreign language will only need to complete the 203 and 204 sections at WVU. If a student wishes to select another foreign language they will need to utilize "General Elective" spots.
