Due to the number of Political Science (PSCI) courses taken at BlueRidge CTC and the number of remaining courses to graduate with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science, student will exceed the Eberly College of Art & Science 42-credit rule. Students will need to take an additional three (3) credit hours to graduate.

A cumulative GPA of 2.0 is required in all POLS courses for graduation.

Students completing degrees in WVU's Eberly College of Arts and Sciences are encouraged to work with their advisors to integrate completion of an academic minor or minors into their programs of study, to the degree allowed within elective hours.
