He has been a national consultant with aha! Process Inc. since 2010, and is a certified trainer for Framework for *Understanding Poverty* and *Bridges Out of Poverty*.

He also has presented both *Framework* and *Bridges* to numerous two and four year colleges and universities, and recently certified as a trainer for *Understanding* and *Engaging Under-Resourced College Students*.

Ott is active in his home community of Dubuque. He is the co-founder of the City of Dubuque's Circles where he is promoting *Bridges Out of Poverty* concepts through presentations, workshops, and facilitating *Getting Ahead in a Just-Gettin'-By World* groups. Jim's energy and storyteling have made him a popular, sought after speaker.
