To be admitted to the English program, student must have a 2.0 GPA in all ENGL classes taken, and a 2.0 overall GPA. The department will accept students with an overall GPA below a 2.00 if it is the result of low grades outside of the Humanities.

\*Students who choose Spanish or German as their foreign language will only need to complete the 203 and 204 sections at WVU. If a student wishes to select another foreign language, they will need to utilize "General Elective" spots.

Students will need to select one (1) Area of Emphasis of 12-credits during their time at WVU:

- Creative Writing
- Literary and Cultural Studies
- Professional Writing and Editing (PWE)

Students completing degrees from the WVU Eberly College of Arts and Sciences are encouraged to work with their advisors to integrate completion of an academic minor or minors into their programs of study. WVU offers over 100 minors that complement major fields of study, build on students' unique interests, expand perspectives, and broaden skills.
